## Notes on Licensing a Colt/Stallion

1. The Society will only register or enter the offspring of colts/stallions which hold a current Veterinary Licence issued by the Welsh Pony & Cob Society in its purebred register.
2. Colts may be licensed from 1<sup>st</sup> January of their 2 year old year. The age of a colt/stallion is determined from 1<sup>st</sup> January and a colt/stallion is regarded as being one year old on 1<sup>st</sup> January next after the year in which it was foaled. 3. Before a Veterinary Certificate may be issued a Veterinary Surgeon shall inspect the colt/stallion to ensure that it is free from disease and shall submit a report to the Society. Report forms (V.C.2) will be issued to the stallion owner on return of the completed application form for a Veterinary Certificate (V.C.1) accompanied by the requisite fee(s) [£188 for members or £234 for non-members]. **Should the colt/stallion hold a Passport in lieu of a Registration Certificate, then this must be returned with the V.C.2 form for endorsement.**
4. The veterinary fee is the responsibility of, and shall be paid by, the stallion owner who shall make direct payment to the Veterinary Surgeon.
5. Stallion owners are advised that a Veterinary Surgeon will not attempt to inspect a colt/stallion found to be unmanageable; unbroken colts/stallions presented for examination must be halter trained.
6. After a colt/stallion is inspected and found correct the Veterinary Surgeon will take a hair sample from the animal for DNA analysis. A DNA sample kit will be supplied to the owner with the Veterinary Report form (V.C.2). The hair sample must be posted immediately to the Animal Health Trust, DNA Typing Unit, Lanwades Park, Kentford, Newmarket, Suffolk. If a Veterinary Certificate is refused the sample kit should be returned to the Society's Office, and the respective fee shall be refunded [£50].
7. A Veterinary Certificate may be refused or revoked if the colt/stallion is:
  - (a) Found on examination not to be free from hereditary disease including cataract, defective genital organs, bone spavin, subluxation of the patella, stringhalt and malocclusion of teeth.
  - (b) Defective or inferior conformation.
8. If a Veterinary Certificate is refused or revoked the colt/stallion owner is entitled to require referee's examination and inspection of the colt/stallion on payment of the appeal fee of £75 payable to the Society. The fee will be returned in part if the appeal is successful.
9. The Society may require any colt/stallion holding a Veterinary Certificate to be examined at any time for the purpose of ascertaining that there are no grounds for the revoking of the Certificate.

**NOTE: The issuing of a Licence in no way guarantees fertility.**

**NOTE: The Society strongly advises against the use of unlicensed Colts/Stallions.**
