Stables (Reg 14)	Booking is for a 24hr period, from 5:00pm to 5:00pm the following day. Accommodation cannot be guaranteed until 5:00pm.
Correctness of Details (Reg 18)	It is the Exhibitors' or Competitors' responsibility to ensure that all the information provided is correct.
Refunds (Reg 20)	Refunds will only be provided on production of a veterinary certificate. which must be received by the Entries Office no more than 7 days after the last day of Show. Levies included in the entry fee will not be refunded. Stable fees will not be refunded.
Eligibility to Enter (Reg 21)	Exhibitors must ensure the entry is registered with the appropriate breed society for the classes being entered and, where necessary, the Owner, Rider and Exhibitor.
Payment of Prizes (Regs 35 & 36)	Winning exhibitors will be issued with a prize money voucher which must be redeemed during the show. Vouchers not presented will be forfeited.
Objections (Reg 40)	Must be made in writing and submitted to the Horse Stewards' Office within 30 minutes of the completion of the class and accompanied by a deposit of £50.
GDPR Condition of Entry	Details of entries made will only be shared with breed societies and/or shows to confirm eligibility and/or qualification. Results will be displayed on the Show's web site. Breed societies will also provide/use some of your information. Please go to the relevant society's web page to view their policy as to how, when and why your details will be used.
Equine Flu (Reg 49)	All equines attending the Royal Bath & West Show 2022 must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

QUALIFIERS 2022

The IDHS (GB) £2000 Challenge

Classes H33 & H34

This show is a Qualifier for the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Challenge. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from each class that is registered or eligible for registration on the ID or IDSH Register with a minimum of 25% provide IF breeding will qualify. Horses need not be registered with the IDHS(GB) to qualify but must be on the IDHS(GB) register by the time of the Championship which will be held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show on 13 & 14 August 2022 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.

A horse may only qualify for the Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.

Each qualifier will receive a card. *Qualifiers are required to complete an on line form at www.idhsqb.com to inform the IDHS(GB) that they have qualified for the Final.* In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 and a trophy. The Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure Bred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50.

Moorbennhall ID Youngstock Challenge

Class H32

This show is a Qualifier for The Moorbennhall Irish Draught Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed **Pure Breeds** from each age group that have not already qualified in the class - yearlings, two year olds and three year olds –eligible for Class 1 in the Irish Draught Breed Register by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID(GB) sire out of a Graded dam. If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify to go forward to their respective final, which will held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show on 13 & 14 August 2022 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ Each qualifier will receive a card. *Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at www.idhsqb.com to inform the IDHS (GB) that they have qualified for the Final.* In the Final, there will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi-finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

British Arabian Championships

Classes H71 to H73

This is a qualifying show for the 2022 final. Qualification is via Gold Card, which is awarded to the first and second prize winners in each class. Completed Cards should be returned within 10 days of the qualifying show with a cheque for £15, or returned before 20 August with a cheque for £30 to Arab Horse Society, Charnham Lane, Hungerford RG17 0EY. Cheques payable to The Arab Horse Society.

Once a horse or pony has qualified for the 2022 Championships on 3 September at Weston Lawns Farm, Bedworth Road, Bulkington, Bedworth, Warwickshire CV12 9JA may enter any of the classes at the show. HC1 The following class is a qualifier for the The Price Family Supreme In-Hand Championship, NEC, Birmingham, 5th-9th October 2022

The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses). The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete, provided it has not already won a qualifying round in 2022.

Hunter Breeding, Hack Breeding, Riding Horse Breeding, Sport Horse Breeding, Irish Draught Breeding, Riding Pony Breeding, Coloured Horse and Pony Breeding, Anglo-Arab or Part Bred Arab, Connemara, Dales & Fell, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Highland, New Forest, Shetland (Miniature), Shetland (Standard), Welsh Mountain Pony (Section A), Welsh Pony (Section B), Welsh Pony (Cob Type) (Section C), Welsh Cob (Section D) and Part Bred Welsh.

If the Champion has already qualified or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion of that section may come forward, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified or are ineligible then the section will not be represented in this qualifying round. Foal champions are not eligible.

In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this Show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the qualification will not pass down to the Reserve in the 2nd and subsequent sections.

There will be no direct entry in The Price Family Supreme In-hand Championship Qualified, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable).

NPS/CUDDINGTON M&M IN HAND SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE

Judge: David Puttock
Judging on: Friday

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand sections.

To be judged under the rules of the NPS. NPS silver medal rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion Pony is not a Member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion Pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

Class H1 HUNTER FILLY, COLT OR GELDING

Yearling, foaled in 2021.

Class H2 HUNTER FILLY, COLT OR GELDING

Two year old, foaled in 2020.

Class H3 HUNTER FILLY, COLT OR GELDING

Three years old, foaled in 2019.

Class H4 SMALL & LIGHTWEIGHT HUNTER BROOD MARE

Small hunter mares to exceed 148cms but not exceeding 158cms with foal at foot or a relevant certificate of pregnancy which may be inspected at the show. Mares which have not yet foaled or that have lost their foals are eligible to enter with a relevant certificate of pregnancy for the following year that may be inspected at the Show.

Small Hunter Mares will be measured on the day of the show by the Show's veterinary officer, unless in possession of a current JMB Height Certificate which must be presented to the Show's veterinary officer instead.

Class H5 HUNTER FOAL

Produce of mare shown in class H4. Foals must be at least four weeks old on the day of the Show.

Class H6 MIDDLEWEIGHT & HEAVYWEIGHT HUNTER BROOD MARE

Exceeding 158cms, with foal at foot or a relevant certificate of pregnancy which may be inspected at the show. Mares which have not yet foaled or that have lost their foals are eligible to enter with a relevant certificate of pregnancy for the following year that may be inspected at the Show.

Class H7 HUNTER FOAL

Produce of mare shown in class H6. Foals must be at least four weeks old on the day of the Show.

CHAMPION PRIZE

HC3 For the Champion Hunter Breeding Brood mare

Brood mares only are eligible. Royal Bath & West Champion rosette and The Harry Hall Bronze Challenge Trophy (H1). Reserve Champion - Royal Bath & West Reserve Champion rosette.

HC4 For the Champion Hunter Breeding Youngstock

1st and 2nd prize winners in classes H1, H2, H3, H5 and H7. Royal Bath & West Champion rosette and The Evans Bevan Perpetual Silver Challenge Cup (H2). Reserve Champion - Royal Bath & West Reserve Champion rosette.

SPECIAL PRIZE

HS1 For the Best Small Hunter Brood Mare in Class H4

The Violet Wellesley Perpetual Challenge Cup (H29) offered by Miss D M P Anthony.

HS2 Brood Mare Premium Awards

SHB(GB) - One offered in the Small & Lightweight Hunter Brood Mare class and one in the Middleweight & Heavyweight Hunter Brood Mare class. The premiums will only be awarded if there are a minimum of three mares forward per class.

It will take the form of a Service Voucher, the value of which is to be determined from time to time by SHB(GB), awarded at the Judge's discretion to their selection from the monetary prize winners, to be used towards the cost of covering the mare by any SHB(GB) Graded Stallion or Life Approved Premium Stallion that is properly registered for the year of covering. This Service Voucher may be used in either of the two years following the year of award. The owner must be, or become, a fully paid up member of SHB(GB) in order to be eligible for the award. No mare shall take more than one award per year.

NOTE: Grade I and II mares are eligible to be transferred into the SHB(GB) Stud Book.

THE THREE SHOWS CHALLENGE 2022

This Challenge is open to everyone competing in the Hunter Breeding Classes at the Royal Bath & West, Royal Cornwall and Devon County Shows, and who live in the South West Region comprising of Cornwall, Devon, Dorset, Gloucester, Hampshire and Wiltshire.

Points will be allocated in the Hunter Breeding Classes (classes H1 to H4 and H6) as follows:

1st - 10 points; 2nd - 7 points; 3rd - 5 points; 4th - 3 points

In the event of a tie, exhibiting history over the three shows would be taken into account.

Where classes are combined, ie Colt, Gelding or Filly, points will be awarded for the highest placed Colt or Gelding and the highest placed Filly. Points will also be awarded for both Lightweight and Heavyweight Brood Mares (foals are not eligible for this award). Points will be accumulated by the horse rather than the owner.

Prizes: Winners of the Three Shows Challenge £100 and Rosette Reserve £50 and Rosette

The Douglas Kellow Memorial Trophy (presented by Mrs Loveday Kellow and Family) will be awarded at the Devon County Show to the winner of the Three Shows Challenge.

Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form, or apply online on the BSHA website.

BSHA Supreme In-Hand Breeding Championships

Four years old or over and registered on the Irish Draught Registers.

Class H34 RIDDEN IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE STALLION*, MARE OR GELDING
Four years old or over and registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse registers.

CHAMPION PRIZE

HC12 For the Champion Ridden Irish Draught / Irish Draught Sport Horse
Royal Bath & West Champion and Reserve Champion rosettes.

RETRAINING OF RACEHORSES

Judges: Polly Walker - Conformation & Clare Poole - Ride
Judging on: Thursday

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Ridden competitors must wear a safety/kit mark hard hat with chinstrap.

Class H35 TATTERSALLS RoR FORMER RACEHORSE CHALLENGE SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2022

Mare or Gelding four years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1 January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must be registered with RoR and HAVE raced in GB. First three to go forward to the championship at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree on 27 August 2022.

The classed to be judged:

50% jumping;

20% style while jumping and performance;

30% for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Phase 1 - Jumping: 8 rustic fences 3ft (90cm) - 3ft 3in (1m) with a maximum spread of 0.95cm. The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 pts for a knock down

15 pts for a refusal

20 pts for a second refusal

Elimination for third refusal or fall or error of course.

Phase 2 - class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some cases, at the judge's discretion, horses may be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in a class).

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: Walk, Trot, Canter (showing change of leg), Extended Canter (gallop), Halt, Stand and Walk Off on a long rein. Total marks out of 30% for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 3ft 6inc (1.05m).

Horses will NOT be ridden by the judge and may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the Judge.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

RoR Prizes: Rosettes and vouchers 1st – 3rd place.

1st £30 plus RoR prize; 2nd £20; 3rd £10.

RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however, qualification for the final will stand.

Class H36 TATTERSALLS RoR NOVICE RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2022

Thoroughbred Mare or Gelding, four years old or over, any height. Rider must be 15 years or over on 1 January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won a ridden open class under affiliated showing society (inc SEIB/HOYS, BHSA, SHB(GB), BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open Show Series Qualifier or any other open class except Tattersalls (TBA) RoR Challenge Show Series or other Working Hunter type classes). Unaffiliated show wins are not taken into account.

Horses may remain in Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show series (formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show series) classes until they have won three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show series qualifiers. They will be de-noviced on their third win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.
